

Global Health: solving local problems with global information

Global Health to include reports from the *Statens folkhälsoinstitut*

Global Health contains over 1.5 million records with 140,000 records added each year and from 2010 will include the English language full-text reports of the *Statens folkhälsoinstitut*, the Swedish Institute of Public Health.

60% of the journals included in Global Health are unique to the database. The database covers all aspects of public health at both international and community level, as well as a wealth of material from other biomedical and life science fields.

Global Health also contains over 9,000 Full Text records including proceedings from key conferences and over 50 core journals including *Community Eye Health Journal*, *Biometrie Humaine et Anthropologie* and *Journal of Rural and Tropical Public Health*.
